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Instructions

In this Reading Comprehension lesson, students will read a short story. Then answer the 5 comprehension questions. Each question page is self correcting by taking the student to a slide that will either say correct or incorrect.

On the last page, there is a writing prompt/question for students to answer and write 2-4 sentences answering the question(s). There are two pages after this for the students to write their answers on.

The answers to the questions are in the story. The last page also has a picture(s) and sometimes a video having to do with the lesson.

How I use this in my online teaching

In my online classes, I will have students read the story aloud to me and I will help them as needed with words that may be difficult for them to pronounce. Then we will answer the 5 comprehension questions together with me going back to the story as needed to show them where in the story the answer to that question is.

On the last page, there is an essay questions. I have students use either paper and pencil, or typing in a doc using screen share so I can help them with sentence structure, grammar, and spelling. If students prefer paper, I will have them either show me on camera in class, or take a picture of their writing and send to me in the appropriate way on the platform they are on with me.

Some stories do have a video to go long with the lesson, but not all do. Use videos that are topic related to help further study on the topic in the story.
